



Bauhaus University – Weimar – Exchange and Erasmus+ Scholarship

Bauhaus-Universität Weimar

Bauhaus University, a top university located in Weimar, Germany, is generously offering (two) scholarships of approximately **4900 Euros** for undergraduate or graduate student exchange.

Key facts:

- Scholarship available to cover a minimum 4-month stay during the German Winter Semester (September 2019 – February 2020). Participating students would not be able to return to UBC for Term 2.
- Intensive German language course available in September before the start of lectures in the Winter Semester.
- While on exchange, undergraduate students are registered in 15 credits at UBC during their exchange and pay their normal tuition rate.
- Graduate Students are eligible if full-time enrolled in a UBC program in the winter term 2019/20.
- Transfer up to 15 credits back to UBC.
- The selected students will be required to register with Go Global and pay the Go Global fee of \$415.
- All other travel and living expenses will be covered by the students, to which the scholarship money may be applied.

Eligibility:

- Strong demonstrated interest in German language and culture (e.g. German courses taken at UBC would be an asset), and/or Media Studies.
- German B1 minimum language requirement, ability and willingness to take courses in German.
- UBC Faculty of Arts undergraduate or graduate students .
- Minimum 70% cumulative average.
- Minimum 70% average in Term 1 of 18W.
- Registered in full-time studies in Term 1 and Term 2 of the 18/19 academic year.
- Completed Faculty of [Arts writing requirement](#) prior to participation in the summer program (e.g. WORDS 150 or ASTU)

Extended Deadline: Please apply to Go Global by May 20, 2019 by following the instructions at:

- Please prepare a letter of motivation max 300 words detailing why you are interested in this program and what benefits it may bring to your academic studies and career or personal goals.
- A study plan listing potential courses you would may wish to take on exchange.

Note that the Go Global advisor and a selection committee from the Department of Central, Eastern and Northern European Studies (CENES) will review all applications and applicants' grades for consideration.
